Traveling to School—Then, And Now (conclusion)
From REMINISCENCES by Winifred McConchie Palmateer, May 29,1992

...Once I drove another horse to school on a rainy day. Coming home at night she happened to see the top of the buggy as I was going uphill and she looked back over her blinder. She gave a terrific lunge and almost snapped my head off as she started galloping off down the road.

It was fun driving a horse to school, though, even if I did have to curry her off, harness her, grease the wagon when it was necessary and put up a bag of grain and hay each morning before we started for school.

I wouldn't trade those experiences and memories for anything. It may be wonderful to have a school bus stop at your door each morning and take you to school and bring you back at night, but it seems to me all country children will remember about their going back and forth to school today is a ride on a bus filled with noisy children

## RE Founding of Chartton Historical Society

On February 21,1966, plans for a society were made at a pre-organization meeting held in the Mission Library.

First officers elected were Frank Lafforthun, president; -William Gottung, vice president; Ruth Bull, recording secretary; Barbara Holbrook, corresponding secretary; and William Moffatt, treasurer.

Other charter members accepted were Ruth Bull, Robert Bull, Janet Moffatt, William Moffatt, Helen Lachtrupp, Christian Lachtrupp, Barbara Heinemann, Robert heinemann, Phylis Gottung, William Gottung, Doris Schaus, Carl Schaus, Frank Fee Jr., Alice Gilmore, Dorothy Graves, Vivian Grunewald, Jane Robbins, Jeanne O'Brien, Irene Yates, Frank Fee Sr., Jan Kirschman, Betty Jordan, Helen Hequembourg, Fred Hequembourg, Barbara Renaud, Betty Lou Wessell, Bettie Larsen, Jess E. Martin, Louise Clark, Barbara Holbrook, Frank Holbrook, Louis Riccardi, Henrietta Van Der Veer, and Clarence Van Der Veer.

On September 19,1969 the society unfurled its new flag. The 3-by 5 foot flag was designed by Steve Jordan and hand-sewn by Helen Kaszubski. Against a bright blue background it displays a picture of the Henry Springer pump. This pump, adopted as the society emblem, was in use as early as 1847. There is no known record from where the pump on the east end of the village, that stood there in 1847, was manufactured or by whom.

Under the leadership of the founder of the society, Frank Lafforthun, the society has featured a Memorial Service each Memorial weekend. Each year a different cemetery is selected for the service and each year a war veteran from that cemetery is entolled.

Each year, in the month of June, the society sponsors a Founders Day celebration. The celebration includes a parade with contingents made up of Charlton residents. At the finish of the parade a celebration is held at the meeting house. There the local organizations and residents have had the opportunity to make a display.

The theme for this years. Founders celebration will feature our 200 th. anniversary, to celebrate the clearing of the wilderness here in 1774, by the early settlers.

The meeting house and folk museum of the society is at St. Pauls Episcopal Church on Maple Avenue which the society purchased in 1971.

Under the leadership of the present president, Fritz Schaus, extensive repairs have been made to the interior of the church.
Repairs are costly but the society hopes that the renovation will be finished by 1975.
