BUILDING AND GROUNDS

This summer has seen the restoration being done to upkeep the buildings and grounds. The Museum was prepared for painting by scraping peeling paint, applying a sealing coat and then the exterior latex paint. Cracked siding pieces, broken windowpanes, and broken shutters were replaced or repaired. Last summer the museum north yard was readied for seeding by removing rocks and cutting overgrown vegetation. The area has been seeded and is growing as seen in the picture below. The bare spots will be fixed in September. The kitchen overhead light and broken/missing ceiling tiles have been replaced.

NEW MUSEUM DISPLAYS

The Charlton Historical Society has used some of our latest donations to make new displays in our museum.



You have seen these items in prior newsletters, and this is how they look today. In the Maud Farrington corner we have her cradle, teether, nursery rhymes book, correspondence, and portraits of her parents and of her mom as a child with her mom's brother. We have Mabel Haynes Bond's dress, beautifully framed by Ann Reinhart's brother, Jim Reinhart, who owns a studio in Connecticut. Also shown is the child's sailor uniform from Nancy Bellamy and WWII era homemade toys on loan from Alice Crotty.

New to the museum this year is the magnificent portrait of Samuel McCrea Cavert that is displayed on an easel placed out of the sun. The portrait will be moved to the Charlton Town Hall after we close the museum for the winter so that it can be kept out for display in a climate controlled environment. A special place in the main hallway of Town Hall has been selected. The museum also has a display board with a short story of Samuel McCrea Cavert's life and accomplishments.

Another new display is Alice Crotty's collection of old door stops, book ends, etc., on loan to add interest to the museum. A pair of them can be seen holding up Maud's nursery rhymes book.
