"Katrina Trask's Legacy in Saratoga Springs"

About the Presenters: Eileen Egan Mack is a graduate of Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake CSD and SUNY Plattsburgh. She is a member of several music groups, singing jazz and classical music. As a singer and storyteller, she enjoys bringing to life the histories of women whose stories are worthy of our attention.



Michael Clement is a well-respected voice teacher and a sought-after accompanist. He has served as accompanist for Opera Saratoga, Skidmore College, the College of St. Rose, Glens Falls Symphony, Schenectady Symphony, and various Capital District choral organizations. He is Minister of Music at Albany's Emmanuel Baptist Church and

is the accompanist for the Mendelssohn Club. He is often a featured pianist at the Sembrich Opera Museum where, last year, he performed with members of the Philadelphia Orchestra.

About the Program: When visitors come to Saratoga, they are often encouraged to visit the Yaddo. There a magnificent mansion overlooks a well-tended rose garden. Visitors are not, for the most part, welcome at the historic home, but the rose garden is open to the public, as that is how Katrina Trask meant it to be. The Yaddo was the home of Spencer and Katrina Trask, and the rose was Katrina's favorite flower. She wanted everyone to be able to come to her garden and experience her favorite flowers in a wonderful setting. The April 28th program, sponsored by the Charlton Historical Society, will open with "Come to the Garden" by Katrina Trask. Vocalist Eileen Egan Mack, and pianist Michael Clement will share lyrics and music that Katrina composed or collaborated on. The program is the result of research by Saratoga artist Rumania Jewett whose search of the archives made the rewarding discovery of Katrina's compositions.

Founders' 'Day Weekend 2024

For Founders' Day this year, the Charlton Historical Society is recognizing West Charlton, also known as the Scotch Church settlement, so named for the many Scottish families that settled here in 1775, or soon thereafter. Jason Nemec will be working on the design of the 2024 Founders' Day button which will display the West Charlton United Presbyterian Church.

Points of interest in the history of West Charlton include this magnificent church, the cemetery, the McWilliam telephone exchange, Hecker Store, Fairbanks Blacksmith Shop, farms, the historic homes of prominent families, and the one room schoolhouses. The Charlton Historical Society has a sign on display in the schoolhouse for the "Scotch Church Grocery". We would love to know more about this grocery and even to have a photo of what it looked like.





Saturday evening live music by Big Sky Country, inflatables, games for kids, petting zoo, face painting, magician, food and desserts, ending with fireworks.






