The Politicians joined the parade and presented their Resolutions and Citations, honoring our first President and Co-Founder, Frank Lafforthun. Frank's stepsons, Walter Hayner and George Krutz, were our Grand Marshalls and we thank them for their participation. We thank John Hussey for his leadership in planning the parade, Teresa Hart for planning the Farmers Market, and Liz Lis for chairing the Art Show. Thanks go to Sue York and to all who volunteered to man the museum and the other activities.

Many June Visitors Came to our Museum

The Charlton Historical Society had a very busy June with visitors from out of Town. On June 20th, Chuck Latham and Bill Wehrle hosted 13 visitors from the Sacandaga Task Force for Senior Living, a group from Northville, NY. We had been contacted months ago by Pat Paton, who wanted to bring her group to Charlton to see our historic buildings and Town. Chuck took their picture in front of the schoolhouse, and judging from their smiling faces, they must have had a good time. Then on June 21st, Chuck, Bill, and I met with CHS members Bonnie and Alan Cook, from Palos Alto Verde, California, for a tour of the museum and schoolhouse. Alan Lincoln Cook is descended from Charlton's Nathanial and Margrett Cook, and both Alan and his wife Bonnie have done extensive research on Alan's ancestors by traveling to various locations in the US and UK. Bonnie and Chuck were able to share Cook family research, and Bonnie found additional information in our Riedinger ancestry collection in the schoolhouse. Then, on June 27th, Chuck and I met with CHS members Fran and Tom Coughlin of Atascadero, California, and Tom's Mom Connie of Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Fran is descended from many famous founding families of Charlton. Her ancestors include Rev. William Clark and John Holmes. John Holmes was elected as an Elder of the Freehold Presbyterian Church in their first election of Elders in 1787. He also built a sawmill in 1774, located where Crane Street crosses the Alplaus, and brought his family to Charlton in 1775. Fran says that she is also descended from the Conde and Kirby families. Our long time member, Gail Harkness, joined us out of interest in that he and his wife Joyce live in the Hamlet in the former home of the same William Clark, a home later owned by the Conde family. Again we shared ancestry information and Fran found more in our Riedinger collection. The Coughlins treated Chuck and me to a wonderful lunch at the Tavern, compliments of Fran's Mom Marian, who could not make the trip and to whom we thank. Lunch was special in that it was also Chuck's birthday. Sue
